PRESENTATION

The main activity of the <u>IAHR Spain Chapter</u> is the coordination (together with the Foundation for the Promotion of Water Engineering) of the Water Engineering Conferences (Jornadas de Ingeniería del Agua - JIA) that have been organized since 2009 by different institutions every autumn of odd-numbered years. In 2016 the IAHR Spain Chapter took the initiative to promote holding a technical meeting on water engineering in even-numbered years, when the Water Engineering Conferences do not take place. The goal was to create an opportunity for the members of the Spain Chapter to meet and also present the JIA program of the following year.

In 2016, the theme of the meeting was the latest news from the IAHR continental hydraulics congresses. The conference reviewed the technical advances presented at the most representative events of the IAHR Technical and Regional Divisions over the course of 2015. In 2018, the topic of the conference was the future prospects for the teaching of hydraulics in engineering schools.

The organization of the 2020 conference has been conditioned by the health emergency caused by COVID-19; prudence dictates that the event be held in a hybrid format (online and in person) and with a shorter duration to facilitate monitoring.

A selection of current issues that have an impact on water engineering and that are therefore considered of interest to the members of the IAHR Spain Chapter have been chosen as the common thread for the conference. These topics are the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG), the consequences of COVID-19, and some new developments related to the assessment of the impact of climate change on the management of water resources.
